Bridge Report

Friends of the Bridge!

The autumnal equinox has arrived, and the summer of 2021 is heading for the exit doors. Though the sailing season carries on year-round, the long days and the sunshine of summer have made us feel almost normal again. We

bounced back from the slowness and “no-ness” of last year’s summer, where events were trimmed back or cut from the calendar altogether. Our regatta schedule and other flag activities have seen a healthy recovery this year.

Regatta registrations have climbed and they show an upward trend. The boat share, paddle board, and kayak activity now account for 20% of the Flag revenue. Both the Lipton Cup and the Encinal Regatta delivered racing in front of the club house, and then flowed into fun and entertainment events on the pool deck and lawn area. The Commodore’s Cup and Encinal Extravaganza Regatta show a clear demand exists for estuary weekend racing, a trend we should continue to explore next year. In financial performance terms, the YTD revenue is 200% over budget.

A couple of things have become clear to me since I joined the bridge three years ago—improvements and new initiatives take more than a year to show results. Theo Rohr and Ted Floyd acquired the J22 “Blue Jay” three years ago and laid the groundwork for the Boat Share Program, and Lisa Rohr and Ashley Woodward established the Paddleboard program. Both of these are now solid contributors to the club’s calendar. As a reminder, click the Boat Share link on our website and reserve a boat to sail or paddle today! Do not forget, “Brotzeit” is the favorite destination across the water.

In addition to running the Boat Share Program, Kevin Clark and his cast of volunteers convened numerous times last year and this year to rebuild our docks, which now provide utility and a show piece for club members and visitors. The L-dock has become ground zero as the race committee location for all



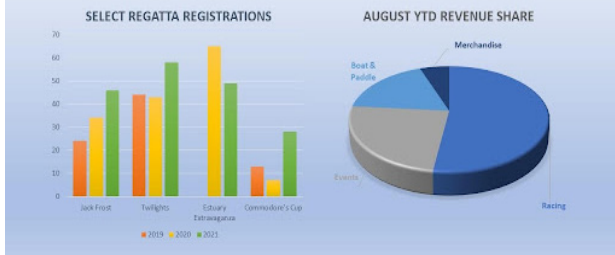

He introduced race tracking software to the Twilight Series and added more value to grow single race day entries: a sponsorship by Scott’s Seafood Restaurant in Jack London Square has brought a coveted “Dinner for four at Scott’s” trophy as the cherry on the cake for the Friday Twilight

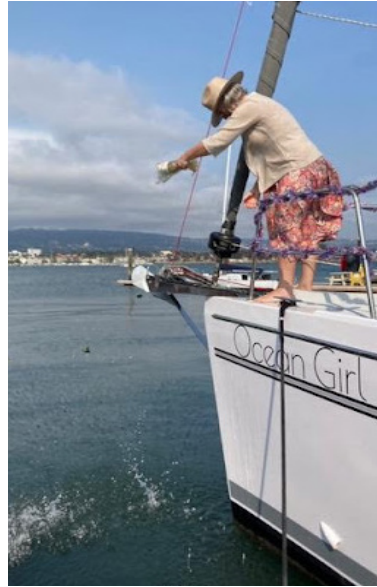


A New Member for the Encinal Fleet! Jens Jenson

Monday night football parties—please sign up if you wish to bring your favorite dish.

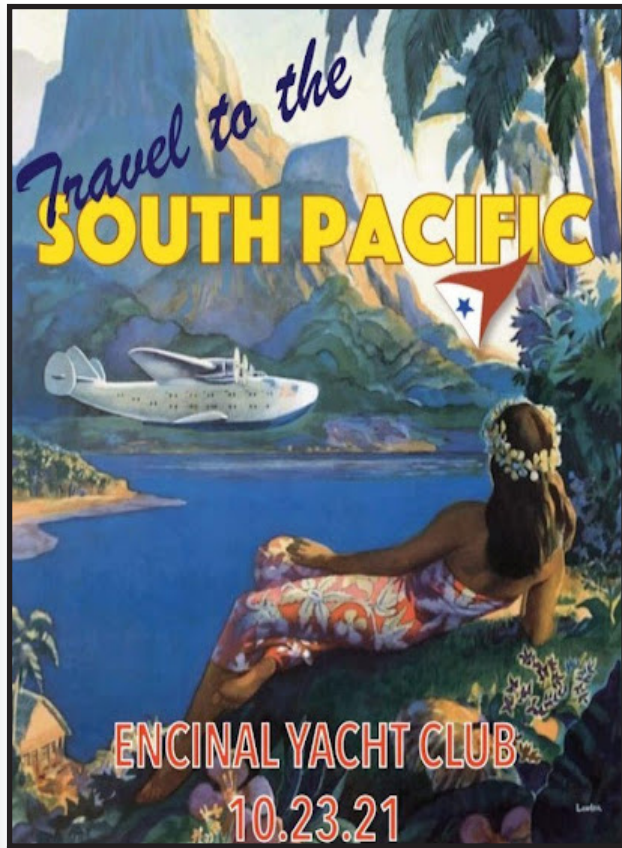
There's family game night, poker and adult bingo night.

Hello fellow members. We need to step up our vigilance and overall club security. Cameras are helpful but much more can be done. We had a kayak and two gas jugs stolen on a Monday or Tuesday just before Labor Day. Fortunately, Deputies Rohr and Floyd were able to find and retrieve the items the next day over at Union Point near the illegal anchor out boats. In addition, OYC liveaboard members recently challenged two men rowing an inflatable in the marina about 2 AM one night. When challenged they started the motor and took off Eastbound (Caribe RIB w/older Evinrude 9.9 CF 5508 RV). The illegal anchor out liveaboard boats continue to be a

growing problem on our waterway. While most are not causing problems, there are a few chronic thieves who pursue theft as a way of life. The police are very hamstrung as to what they can do about it so it is up to all of us to raise our vigilance.

Here are some things we can all do. If you have bicycles, small boats, kayaks, or paddle boards at the club, be sure they are locked at all times. Do not leave portable jugs or gas tanks where they can be grabbed during a crime of opportunity. If you see someone you do not know at the club, always greet them. A friendly hello and introduction goes a long way toward finding out if they should be there or not.
