

New To Sailing or Yacht Clubs!

What does, "The Flag refer to in regard to officers of the club?

"The Flag" refers to the Commodore, Vice Commodore, and the Rear Commodore. Their main job is to promote, organize, and run Regattas on behalf of the club. In addition, they are involved in the running and functioning of all other aspects of the Yacht Club.

What do the follow flags mean?

When you see one or all of the flags flying on the Yacht Club's **Mast Yardarms**, you know there is a flag officer on the premises. (*yardarms* are the horizontal timbers or spars mounted on a mast,) The flags will also be displayed on the tables of where the officers are dining.

Is it a flagpole or is it a mast on the Yacht Club property?

The flagpole at a yacht club traditionally represents the mast of a sailing ship. In years past, the yacht club mast would standout if you were arriving by water or by land. It would tell yachtsman wind direction, wind speed and if you were at the right club. I think it is a mast!

EYC Race Committee & EYC Jr. Sailing Volunteer Winners




