Hello once again from the Flag Officers of the Encinal Yacht Club. Jens, Theo and I have some exciting news for anyone in the club who has wanted to try their hand at sailing a club keelboat only to discover that the club didn't have a boat

available for member use. Well we're happy to let you now know that the club has a J22 Blue Jay that the Flag is able to make available for charter to qualified skippers.

The goals for Blue Jay are to provide a training platform for Encinal Lipton Cup Team members and to make the boat available to club members for entry in Estuary and some Bay races run by Encinal and other local clubs. Currently the boat has been chartered for the EYC Summer Twilight Series by Don Ahrens and is currently available for Gracie and George, Commodores Cup and Jack Frost Series. In addition to these Encinal run races the boat is entered in the OYC Sweet Sixteen race series and the Island Friday night series. If you would like to charter the boat for any of these races you

should send an email to vicecommodore@ encinal.org and I'll work with you to become one of our certified J22 skippers authorized to charter and race the clubs boat.

How do I become a certified J22 skipper you

ask, well you will need to come out with two different flag officials who can check you out in the boat. You should be a capable skipper prepared to share your sailing resume(for our documentation) and go for two check out sails where the official will provide you some minor instruction and answer questions while documenting your ability to handle the boat in a variety of situations. We'll give you some feedback and work with you toward getting a certification. This is not a sailing school so the officials will expect you to be competent in general boat and sail handling. They will be able to help you with specific rigging questions and/or techniques which are particular to this specific boat but will be relying on your

experience as a sailor to manage the boat.

The current cost to charter the Blue Jay once your certified is \$75 per race day and we will offer a discounted price of \$300 to charter the boat for each half of our Twilight Series. You don't need to charter the boat for the entire series so single race days/ evenings would also be fine however we will give priority to skippers who want the boat for a full series. We are looking forward to getting more club members certified and out sailing the Blue Jay so


who made this evening a great success and a night to be remembered for all of our sailors.




